President's Remarks

It's signed, sealed and delivered!

City Manager Jack Tuttle advised us that amendments to the restricted covenants on the Paper Mill Creek property have been signed by the State Attorney General and W&M President Gene Nichol. Approval enables us to proceed with negotiations with the city for a long term lease on a portion of the 35 acres. Preliminary meetings have been scheduled with our architect and fellow gallery member Carlton Abbott, to review initial requirements pertaining to those negotiations. We will keep you posted on all future developments.

Lisa Freeman of E. L. Freeman, a Williamsburg-based fund raising consultant, has commenced work on a feasibility study to help guide the board in the design of and preparation of a capital campaign. Her written report will be presented to the board in early January 2008. So, plans are moving forward on the exciting transformation of the gallery to become the Williamsburg Visual Arts Center.

I hope many of you attended the second annual *Dance the Decade - Art in Motion* fundraiser. It was an even greater success than last year's event. Cindy May and her committee did an outstanding job in organizing and managing this special event.

This summer we hired Lori Jakubow as parttime Outreach Director. Lori has done a fine job of moving quickly to expand our art education programs by increasing adult and children's classes, establishing a partnership arrangement with the Williamsburg Landing to use their new facilities for classes, and introducing iconography and pottery to our class offerings.

A new lectures series commenced this month and will run through next March. They are made possible through our partnership with the Virginia

In addition, she was also awarded third place in the Virginia Watercolor Society 28th Annual juried Exhibition 2007 currently on display the Charles Taylor Arts Center in Hampton.

Karen Schwartz won an "Award of Excellence" in September for her painting "Crossing the Millennium Bridge" from the Central Virginia Watercolor Guild at their Annual Exhibition at the McGuffey Arts Center.



Archie Fripp has been named Official Photographer for This Century Art Gallery. Mr. Fripp's unique photography background will enhance the coverage of the Gallery's rich visual arts, education. and outreach programs.

Archie and his wife Jean are long standing members and volunteers of the Gallery.

Mr. Fripp is retired from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. In his previous work he used cameras to record images of the inner workings of nature not only with light but also with electrons and x-rays. Using experiences with microchips, he helped develop the digital camera that now sits on the planet Mars. He also helped evaluate and choose the first cameras for the Hubble Space Telescope.



Pat Wilson's painting "Calla Lilies in Watercolor" is a winner in the Easter Seals 2008 Seal Art Contest. Ten finalists are selected by Easter Seals and the winners are chosen by an online vote.

Pat learned about the contest because she has an autistic granddaughter and Easter Seals provides resources and help for families living with autism.

Pat's painting is one of six winners that is chosen to be represented on Easter Seal stamps and distributed to 15 million homes in February 2008 as part of the Easter Seals annual fund drive.

Pat began painting many years ago in her native New Jersey, using pastels and specializing in

children's portraits. She started working in watercolor when she and her husband, Jack, retired to Williamsburg in 1989. She has studied under several watercolor artists in this area. Pat is a member and volunteer at This Century Art Gallery where she has exhibited her work.


MVP cards are available at any Food Lion. The program does not interfere with the MVP discounts and no MVP product has to be purchased to participate.


including Ernie Els, JoAnn Falletta, Tom Clancy, Marcel Desaulniers, Fuzzie Zoeller, and the Daily Press.
